EARLY ACTION DATES FOR SUMMER & FALL 2026 ANNOUNCED

REVISED DEADLINES GIVE STUDENTS MORE TIME TO SUBMIT MATERIALS, INCLUDING OCT. TEST RESULTS

UCF is introducing new Early Action (EA) deadlines for the 2025-26 admission cycle. First-time-in-college (FTIC) students who wish to apply through EA must submit their application and \$30 application fee (or approved fee waiver) by October 15. All required supporting documents, including official test scores and the SPARK Form. must be received by November 15. Students are encouraged to request their official SAT, ACT or CLT scores well in advance of the deadline to ensure timely delivery. Applicants who meet the EA deadlines will receive a final admission decision or deferral for new information on

December 5.

Early Action at UCF is non-binding. Students admitted through this option must confirm their enrollment by May 1. Admitted EA students also receive priority consideration for merit scholarships and early access to the on-campus housing application.

UCF will continue to review applications on a rolling basis for students who complete their application after November 15. These applicants will receive decisions on a rolling basis between January and May. Students who apply after the EA deadlines are not eligible for deferral and may receive an admission decision of admit, pathway admit, waitlist, or deny.

APP NUMBERS DEMONSTRATE POPULARITY OF EARLY ACTION

Early Action proved to be a popular choice for first-year students applying to UCF in 2025. Of the 65,787 first-year applications received for Fall 2025 - a 16% increase over the previous year - more than two-thirds of admitted students applied through EA. In total, 17,087 students were admitted through this non-binding process, compared to 8,542 through regular or rolling admission.

The strong participation in EA reflects students' desire to plan early, demonstrate interest in UCF, and benefit from the flexibility of early notification, priority scholarship review, and early access to the on-campus housing application.

COLLEGE REALIGNMENT & NEW DEGREES ADDED

As part of a strategic academic realignment, the College of Undergraduate Studies and its degree programs will be integrated into the College of Community Innovation and Education. The Fall 2025 change will

streamline student support and enhance the academic experience.

NEW: Health Informatics

This fully online program prepares students to manage and analyze health data using technology to improve patient care and healthcare systems.

NEW: Health Information Management

This program trains students to oversee the secure use and maintenance of health records and information systems. It combines healthcare knowledge with business, technology and regulatory compliance to support patient care and organizational efficiency.

NEW: Interdisciplinary Healthcare Studies

Designed for students seeking a broad foundation in healthcare, this program in the College of Health Professions & Sciences integrates coursework from multiple disciplines to explore the delivery, policy, and practice of healthcare. It prepares graduates for diverse roles in health services, administration, and community health.

NEW: Business Analytics

This new degree option provides students with the foundational education required to work in this fast-growing field of business. Students have to declare Pre-Economics BSBA as a major first and then fill out a form to declare Business Analytics after they are admitted to the College of Business.
