
FOUNDATION ATTAINMENT

COLLEGES' TOTAL




2013-2017 TRENDS


ALUMNI GIVING

Double alumni annual giving donors to 30,000 by 2020.




ENDOWED PROFESSORSHIPS AND CHAIRS

FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT


Increase UCF Foundation endowment to \$175 million by 2020.
