

STEP 1: Establish your Downtown Campus password

To access systems on the Downtown campus, you must establish a Downtown campus password using the **Account Password Reset** tool. This is in addition to your regular VC-DTC ID password.

- Navigate to mynid.ucf.edu
- Within the “**Account**” field, type your MyVC username.
- Complete the captcha field as prompted and select “**Next**”.
- Follow the remaining prompts to create your Downtown campus password.

TIP: We recommend using the same password for your VC-DTC ID accounts. When you change your MyVC password, you should also change your Downtown campus password following the steps listed above.

STEP 2: Purchase your Downtown Campus Parking Permit

Parking is not free on the downtown campus. Students need to purchase a virtual parking permit from UCF Parking and Transportation Services to park in student spaces on campus.

- Navigate to parking.ucf.edu
- Select “**Permits**” from the menu bar at the top and then select “**Purchase a Permit.**”
- Once you “**Start Your Order**”, use your **MyVC Username @ucf.edu** and your Downtown Campus password to sign in.
 - Ex. A Valencia student, John Smith, whose email is `jsmith1@mail.valenciacollege.edu` would use **`jsmith1@ucf.edu`** to sign in.
- Then, provide your contact, vehicle, and payment information.
